A popular type of DVD disc of the same size as a CD, mainly containing video images.


Region number

DVD discs are programmed with region numbers indicating countries in which they can be played. This system can play discs with region number "1" or "ALL". Region number (playable area number)





DVD-Video discs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie is a separate "title". "Chapters" are subdivisions of titles.



■ DVD-R/DVD-RW/DVD+R/DVD+RW

- You can play DVD-R/DVD-RW/DVD+R/DVD+RW discs recorded in the video mode.
- Before playing DVD-R/DVD-RW/DVD+R/DVD+RW discs with this unit, finalize them with the equipment used for recording.

■ Video CD/audio CD

Track

Video CD and audio CD are composed of "tracks". Tracks are equivalent to songs on a CD.







An MP3 file is audio data compressed in the MPEG 1 audio layer 3 format. MP3 files have the extension ".mp3". (Files with the extension ".mp3" may not play, or noise may occur during playback if not recorded in the MP3 format.)

A JPEG file is still image data compressed in the JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) format. JPEG files have the extension ".jpg".





■ FM/AM loop antenna connection

Connect the FM/AM loop antenna to the ANTENNA jack.

Position the FM antenna wire and rotate the AM loop antenna for optimum reception. Place the AM loop antenna on a shelf, or attach it to a stand or a wall.



Notes:

- Placing the antenna on the stereo system or near the AC power cord may cause noise pickup. Place the antenna away from the stereo system for better reception.
- Do not connect the attached FM antenna to an external antenna as this may cause trouble.



■ Speaker connection

Insert the front speaker plugs (black) into the FRONT terminals. Insert the subwoofer plug (red) into the SUBWOOFER terminal.



Caution:

- The supplied speakers are exclusively for the XL-DV60. Do not connect them to other equipment, and do not connect other speakers to the XL-DV60. It may cause malfunction.
- Use speakers with an impedance of 6 ohms or more, as lower impedance speakers can damage the unit.
- Do not mistake the right and the left channels. The right speaker is the one on the right side when you face the unit.
- Do not allow any objects to fall into or to be placed in the bass reflex ducts of the speakers.
- Do not stand or sit on the speakers. You may be injured.


■ Front speaker grills are removable

Make sure nothing comes into contact with the speaker diaphragm when you remove the speaker grilles.

■ Placing the speaker system



Notes:

- Place the TV halfway between the front speakers.
- The bass sound from the subwoofer is omni-directional, however, it is recommended to place it as close as left and right speakers.
- Place the subwoofer on a sturdy and stable surface as it tends to vibrate while reproducing bass sounds.
- Keep the free space of at least 4" (10 cm) along the right side of the subwoofer.

■ Magnetically shielded speakers

The speakers are magnetically shielded.

Therefore, they do not affect the display even if you use them near the TV. However, some color variation may occur, depending on the type of TV used.

If color variation occurs...

Turn off the TV (from the power switch). After 15 - 30 minutes, turn the TV on again.

If the color variation is still present...

Move the speakers further away from the TV.

If any kind of magnet or an electromagnet is placed too close to the TV and the system, irregular colors may appear on the TV screen.


■ TV connection

Three types of jacks (VIDEO OUT, S-VIDEO OUT and COMPONENT VIDEO OUT) are available for connection of a TV and this unit. Connect according to your TV.

Connecting to a TV with a video input jack:

You can enjoy DVD images by connecting your TV and this unit with the supplied video cable.

Set the video mode to "Interlace" (default setting). For the procedure, refer to "Changing the video mode" on page 17.




- Change the TV input in accordance with the connected jack.
- Do not connect other equipment (VCR, etc.) between the TV and this unit. Pictures may be distorted.
- Refer to the operation manual of the equipment to be connected.
- Insert the plugs fully to avoid fuzzy pictures or noise.

Connecting to a TV with an S-video input jack:

If your TV is equipped with an S-video input jack, you can enjoy higher quality images by connecting it with an S-video cable (not supplied).

Set the video mode to "Interlace" (default setting). For the procedure, refer to "Changing the video mode".




Note:

When the video and S-video cables are both connected, the images from the S-video input jack appears on your TV.

Changing the video mode:

- Insert a DVD disc (steps 1 6, pages 22 23).
 While in the stop mode, press the SHIFT button and DIRECT/ VIDEO MODE button on the remote control.

Each time these buttons are pressed, the mode will change in the following order:



Progressive Select this for a progressive scan TV (use a component video cable).


Caution:

To enjoy images on a TV, make sure to select the right items for the following four: video cable, TV's video input jack, and this unit's video output jack and video mode. Otherwise, images do not appear properly.

Connecting to a TV with component video input jacks:

If your TV is equipped with component video input jacks, purchase a component video cable to enjoy higher quality images.

For a progressive scan TV, set the video mode to "Progressive". Select "Interlace" for a non-progressive scan TV.



Notes:

- If your TV has different indications for the component video inputs (Y, B-Y and P-Y), connect jacks with its matching color.
- Some component video jacks designed for the high-vision system are not compatible with DVD. Do not connect this unit to those component video input jacks. (Images may appear distorted or may not appear due to the system difference.)


What is progressive scanning?

The conventional TV system displays 30 frames of still images per second to perform a series of movements (interlaced scanning). Whereas, progressive scanning displays one frame every 1/60th of a second (60 frames per second) to ensure less flickers and highdensity images.

System connections (continued)

■ Connecting the AC power cord

After checking all the connections have been made correctly, connect the AC power cord to the AC power input jack, then plug the AC power cord of this unit into the AC outlet. If you plug in the unit first, the unit will enter the demonstration mode.



Notes:

- Never use a power cord other than the one supplied. Otherwise, a malfunction or an accident may occur.
- Unplug the AC power cord from the AC outlet if the unit will not be in use for a prolonged period of time.

Cooling fan:

A cooling fan is built into this unit for better heat radiation. Do not cover the opening in this section with any obstacles to avoid damage to the unit.




■ Demonstration mode

When you plug the unit in for the first time, the unit will enter the demonstration mode. You will see words scroll.



To cancel the demonstration mode:




■ Battery installation

Use 2 "AA" size batteries (UM/SUM-3, R6, HP-7 or similar). Batteries are not included.

- 1 Remove the battery cover.
- 2 Insert the batteries according to the direction indicated in the battery compartment.

When inserting or removing the batteries, push them toward the ⊖ battery terminals.

3 Replace the cover.



Precautions for battery use:

- Replace all old batteries with new ones at the same time.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for long periods of time. This will prevent potential damage due to battery leakage.

Caution:

- Do not use rechargeable batteries (nickel-cadmium battery, etc.).
- Installing the batteries incorrectly may cause the unit to malfunction.

Battery removal:

Remove the battery cover. Push each battery toward the \ominus battery terminal and take them out.

Notes concerning use:


- Replace the batteries if the operating distance is reduced or if the operation becomes erratic.
- Periodically clean the transmitter on the remote control and the sensor on the unit with a soft cloth.
- Exposing the sensor on the unit to strong light may interfere with operation. Change the lighting or the direction of the unit if this occurs.
- Keep the remote control away from moisture, heat, shock, and vibrations.

- Stop positions may be recorded on some discs. When you play such a disc, playback stops there.

Sudden temperature changes, storage or operation in an extremely humid environment may cause condensation inside the cabinet (laser pickup, etc.) or on the transmitter on the remote control. Condensation may cause the unit to malfunction. If this happens, leave the power on with no disc in the unit until normal playback is possible (about 1 hour). Wipe off any condensation on the transmitter with a soft cloth before operating the unit.

■ If trouble occurs

When this product is subjected to strong external interference (mechanical shock, excessive static electricity, abnormal supply voltage due to lightning, etc.) or if it is operated incorrectly, it may malfunction.

If such a problem occurs, do the following:

- 1 Set the unit to the stand-by mode and turn the power on again.
- 2 If the unit is not restored in the previous operation, unplug and plug in the unit, and then turn the power on.

If neither operation above restores the unit, clear all the memory by resetting it.

Maintenance

■ Cleaning the laser pickup lens

In order to ensure proper operation of the DVD player, preventative maintenance (cleaning of the laser pickup lens) should be performed periodically. Lens cleaners are commercially available. Contact your local DVD software dealer for options.

Cleaning the cabinet

Periodically wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth and a diluted soap solution, then with a dry cloth.

Caution:

- Do not use chemicals for cleaning (gasoline, paint thinner, etc.). It may damage the cabinet finish.
- Do not apply oil to the inside of unit as this may cause malfunctions.

■ Care of discs

Discs are fairly resistant to damage, however mistracking can occur due to an accumulation of dirt on the disc surface. Follow the guidelines below for maximum enjoyment from your disc collection and player.

- Do not write on either side of the disc, particularly the non-label side from which signals are read. Do not mark this surface.
- Keep your discs away from direct sunlight, heat, and excessive moisture.
- Always hold the discs by the edges. Fingerprints, dirt, or water on the discs can cause noise or mistracking. If a disc is dirty or does not play properly, clean it with a soft, dry cloth, wiping straight out from the center, along the radius.
